


- ✓ 3 Ports including the Free Port of Trieste, the only international free port in Europe





Provincial distribution of headquarters and local units (LU) of Friuli Venezia Giulia's electronics enterprises






Regional electronics enterprises by business size1





The Free Port of Trieste

Unique advantages for your business



Features

- All kinds of goods (both EU and non-EU) may be stored
- No limit of time on the storage of goods
- Non-EU goods stored in the Free Port are free of import duties, VAT and other import charges. No bank guarantee is due as long as the goods are in the Free Port
- The customs origin of goods can be retained
- The Free Port can be home to any kind of industry, trade or ancillary activities
- If extra EU goods are imported, they may benefit from a 180 day delay in the payment of customs duties, VAT and excise duties
- Goods may be subject to industrial processing

Advantages

- Harbor duties lower than in other Italian ports
- Simplified transit for commercial vehicles directed abroad
- Vehicle tax exemption for international vehicles







Tax relief

In Friuli Venezia Giulia, the tax on production activities (IRAP) is equal to zero for the first three years

Subsidized loans

The region provides a series of **subsidized loans and mortgages** with a **one-stop-shop evaluation**; the maximum duration is 15 years at a favorable interest rate



The Port of Trieste - Trieste Passenger Terminal





Trieste, Friuit venezia Giulia

- 1st Italian port in terms of growth trend in the number of ship calls for 7 consecutive years from 2016 to 20221
- **2**nd Italian port by growth trend in the number of passengers handled in 2021 and 2022¹
- **3**rd **Italian** port for **embarkations/disembarkations** (homeport) in 2022 (57%)¹
- 3rd Mediterranean port by % change in passengers handled in 2022 compared to 2021¹
- For Trieste Passenger Terminal, 2023 was a record year: an impressive 476,641 cruise passengers were handled by the Trieste terminal compared to 424,503 in 2022. An increase of more than 50,000 passengers, representing a 12% increase in traffic²


